The CCA course is an advanced level program that builds on the foundational concepts introduced in the Principles of Construction Documentation course. It is designed for individuals involved in all aspects of construction, including Contract Administrators, Property Managers, Architects, Engineers, Interior Designers, Specification Consultants, Building Authorities and Bonding and Insurance Agencies.

The primary course organizer and instructor was David Graham of d. graham Architecture, with Module assistance provided by Eddie Williams of Steller Architectural Consulting and Emily Drown of Stevenson Luchies And Legh - Lawyers. The course ran from November 2012 through February 2013, with the final exam held on February 20, 2013.
